The focus is to address an individual and family's protective factors and rebuild and sustain an improved quality of life in the community, focusing on:


- Integrating those struggling with substance abuse and mental health issues back into the community,

- □ RISE & RISE Family Programs: Care Coordination for individuals & families struggling with substance misuse, mental health, and/or cooccurring disorders.
- □ Screen Out Cases: a Prevention Program focused on working with pregnant women actively misusing substances.

# COMMUNITY SERVICES — OUTREACH, PREVENTION, & CARE COORDINATION EXPLAINED

#### **OUTREACH**

- Host quarterly community education and outreach Inspire to Rise events that cater to the community and includes the participants.
- ☐ Collaborate with other service providers, businesses, etc.



☐ Follow up with referred participants at their home.

#### **PREVENTION**

- Eliminate barriers to services bus passes, virtual services, participant portals.
- ☐ Provide resources to support families diapers, food bags, welcome baby bag.
- Connect to available supports in the community.

#### CARE COORDINATION

- ☐ Enroll through portal, in office, via telehealth, and in home / community.
- Assess in home safety issues.
- Conduct developmental screenings for babies/children and link to care.
- ☐ Provide education on parenting and life skills to adults/caregivers.
- ☐ Work towards participant identified treatment goals.

☐ Individualized & Group Parenting Education: Nurturing Parenting Program, Circle of Security, Healthy Start Partners for Healthy Babies – Available Face to Face or Virtual.



- ☐ Coached Parenting: In home or at visitation services.
- ☐ <u>Visitation Services</u>: Available at 3 Inspire To Rise Centers, in community, or virtually.
- Individual or Group Life Skills for Adults and Teens: In person or virtually.
- ☐ Safety Plan Support: Post reunification or during unsupervised visits.
- ☐ <u>Free Group Tutoring</u>: Once a week at ITR Main Campus on Westside.
- ☐ Healthy Start: Free home visiting program for prenatal mothers or children 0-36 months. Care coordination, prenatal and parenting education, and developmental screenings.

<u>RISE – Outpatient</u>: a program designed to help develop a sober lifestyle through psychoeducation on substances, the effect of substances, relapse prevention, developing coping skills, and build a network of support. Through the outpatient program, participants gather further understanding into their substance use and are given specific skills to learn how to target their addictive behaviors.

<u>RISE – Intervention</u>: a program tailored to continue to help maintain the sobriety of participants that have already developed a foundation for sobriety. In this program they continue to develop and strengthen coping skills, relapse prevention tactics, and strengthen their sober community.

<u>RISE – Family</u>: an intensive in-home prevention and treatment program tailored to address families' struggling with substance abuse and/or mental health needs to resource connection, treatment, intervention, education, and overall wellness.

### PEER COMMUNITY ADVOCACY EXPLAINED

#### Overdose2Action (OD2A) Peer Community Advocacy Program:



Peer Recovery Support Specialist are paraprofessionals that have a first-hand understanding of the challenges regarding sobriety. They:

- ☐ Help participants develop a recovery plan and support network to strengthen the recovery process.
- ☐ Advocate for the participants to ensure all needs are met in a holistic approach.
- ☐ Teach participants how to develop their network of support and life skills in our weekly peer individual sessions and groups.

### INSPIRE TO RISE — OUR STRENGTH IS COLLABORATION

- ☐ There is strength in unity, and collaborative partnerships with stakeholders like you who also have a vested interest in seeing their local community thrive is the key to the success of the Inspire to Rise Community Center model.
- ☐ The collaborative partnerships and holistic approach provides additional wraparound, concrete supports, educational opportunities, and family functioning and resiliency supports to our most vulnerable populations impacted by substance misuse, mental health, child abuse and neglect, and trauma.
- □ <u>Ultimate Impact</u>: Address mental health needs and substance misuse issues, reduce the number of child removals; reduce the infant mortality rates; reduce the number of children born with neonatal abstinence syndrome; and reduce families' involvement with the Department of Children and Families and the criminal court system.





### INSPIRE TO RISE TEAM — SUCCESS

### New Partnership with Feeding Northeast Florida, in partnership with Tamika's School of Epicure:

- ☐ On 8/25/23, we were approved to be a Feeding NEFL food distribution site.
- □ Distributions were completed on 09/21/23, 09/22/23, and 09/23/23.
- □ Distributions are now done every Tuesday at 12 PM and every Saturday at 11:00 AM.

### **Participant Success Story:**

□ Jane\* is a transgender female receiving peer services at Inspire to Rise. She was self-medicating with marijuana and obtaining gender affirming hormones illegally. Now, she receives services and treatment regularly and is receiving medication and hormone therapy legally. Most importantly, she has stopped using marijuana without effort. She says that she does not need it anymore and recognizes that she wasn't happy with herself and her situation.

### **Community Outreach Impact:**

- □ 305 individuals were documented receiving supports at community outreach events. The participants were provided with Narcan, Deterra, condoms, and flyers.
- □ Two individuals approached peers at outreach events and reported successful overdose reversals from Narcan obtained from Inspire to Rise. THAT'S TWO LIVES SAVED!
